## <u>Primary Care Shortage More Dire than Prior Estimates: Comparing</u> Real Panel Size to Estimated Panel Size

We queried the Virginia All-Payer Claims Database to identify the mean and median number of unique patients a PCP saw each year between 2016 and 2019. Based on the 2019 "real" panel size of 1,368 patients, <u>Virginia needs 30% more PCPs (1,456) than we currently have (4,872 clinicians) in order for every Virginian to have a PCP.</u>

## <u>Telehealth critical for access to primary care, but only with adequate</u> payment

We found that practices worry about sustainability (61% are concerned that reimbursement will be discontinued and 45% report they don't plan to continue promoting video visits) and that telephone visits are integral to telehealth (25% of visits are by telephone only, 53% of practices report patients have difficulty accessing video visits, 64% report patients' internet connection limits video visits, and 17% report patients don't want video visits at all).
